- A detailed statement of the nature and purpose of the various proposed uses in the proposed receiving area, the amount of groundwater to be used for each purpose, and the requested annual volume to be transported outside the District.
- The feasibility of accessing alternative water supplies available to the applicant, including proximity to water sources.

#### I, the undersigned applicant, hereby agree and certify that:

- for a new well, this well will be drilled within 30 feet of the location specified and not elsewhere;

# Attachment #1 Aurthur A. Seeligson &Larja Company Detailed Statement for Brush Country Production Permit Application Request #249-0031-2020

- 1. Zachary Construction hired Page Water Well Drilling to drill a new water well on October 20, 2020 on property belonging to Aurthur A. Seeligson & Larja Company. A 7.5 hp submersible pump has been installed on this well and it has been registered as BCGCD well #249-0031-2020. The well location is located on a 1,545 acre tract of land owned by Mr. Aurthur A. Seeligson & Larja Company which sits North of the Premont Hwy 281 bypass that is presently being constructed by Zachary Construction Company. The nature and purpose of water pumped from this well is to provide water to Zachary Construction Co. for the purpose of constructing the hwy. 281 bypass around the North East side of Premont, Texas. The well has a pump size of 7.5 HP and the water from this well will be used for commercial use. BCGCD classifies this well as a non-exempt water well and will need a production permit in order to operate the well. Mr. Seeligson has applied for production permit for this well for a maximum pumping of 10,000,000 gallons(30.6 acre ft.) per year. Mr. Seeligson has paid the \$100 application fee to register a new water well as required by BCGCD Rules.
- 2. Water Well Driller Bo Page has declared that the 7.5 hp submersible pump has the capacity to pump 50 gpm at pump depth of 350 ft. BCGCD well spacing rule requirement of 1.25 ft horizontal spacing per gpm pumped(on Evangeline Aquifer) would require minimum spacing distance of 62.5 ft between the location of the well head and the nearest neighbor's property line. Current well distance meets the District's well spacing requirement for a non-exempt water well.
- 3. 



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

### South

Most of the precipitation fell on the eastern third of the Southern Region associated with a frontal boundary during Wednesday and Thursday (Dec. 23-24). This led to some minor trimming of D0 in south-central Tennessee and extreme northwestern Alabama which received 1.5 to 2 inches of rain. However, locations along and west of the Mississippi River observed below-normal weekly totals, warranting further expansion of D0 in eastern and northern Arkansas. Some slight improvement (D1 to D0) and removal (D0) north of Houston was also justified in localized areas that received more than 1.5 inches of rainfall. Light precipitation fell over parts of Oklahoma and Texas Monday into Tuesday (Dec. 28-29) as energy exiting the southern Rockies and intensified across the Central and Southern Plains. Despite the late arrival of the system in the Plains this

week, the previous week's release of the Drought Monitor remained representative of conditions across Oklahoma and most of Texas. However, southern Texas saw some slight degradation along the Lower Rio Grande Valley, with D3 expanded northward from Starr County to Webb County, and D2 expansion southward into southeastern Hidalgo and western Cameron Counties. This region has experienced low relative humidity and topsoil moisture. NASA SPORT soil moisture data depicts the top 10 cm of soil below the 2nd percentile in areas where D3 was expanded, and between the 5th and 10th percentiles where D2 was expanded. NASA GRACE ground water data and the National Land Data Assimilation System (NLDAS) also support this deterioration.
